Human Growth and Development is an optional curriculum taught at each grade level in middle school as a component of Catalina Foothills School District's K-12 Comprehensive Health Curriculum. In accordance with state statutes, written parental permission is a requirement for student participation in the lessons delineated herein.

In Seventh Grade, students will:

Annotated List of Seventh Grade Videos:

Session 3:

DVD: *Understanding HIV and AIDS*, 18 minutes (Human Relations Media)

This video provides students with the facts about HIV and AIDS. It presents an age-appropriate review of the basic terms, definitions, and biology of the HIV virus plus means of infection, treatment, and protection. The program also sends a clear message that abstinence is the only 100% effective option for avoiding sexual transmission of the HIV virus. It includes a dialogue with middle school students and two HIV positive young people on issues that impact their lives: How should a HIV+ person be treated by others? What are the common misconceptions about how HIV is acquired? What strategies and life skills can teens use to stop the pressures that might expose a young person to HIV?

Session 4:

DVD: *Taking Charge: Resisting Sexual Pressure*, 29 minutes (Human Relations Media)

Through a variety of common sexual pressure scenes, the video shows students the importance and desirability of setting clear sexual limits in advance and teaches them refusal skills and assertiveness techniques they can use to stay in control in specific sexual situations.

Session 5:

DVD: *B Careful When U Txt: The Dangers of Texting and Sexting*, 19 minutes (Human Relations Media)

Today, kids no longer have to wait to get to a desktop computer to see and hear all of the latest gossip. It's right in their hands, on their cell phones, mobile email devices, and handheld computers, giving them the ability to take and send pictures and videos and instantly access social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter. Using dramatic scenarios as well as first person experiences, the video explores the positive and negative sides of this technology. It gives viewers a primer on the Do's and Don'ts of text messaging, including the laws on privacy and child pornography, setting and maintaining personal boundaries, dealing with unforeseen consequences, and underscoring the need to “think before you click.”
